




TRENDS IN HEALTHCARE

- GME NOT KEEPING PACE WITH THE RETIREMENT OF PHYSICIANS
 - Due to aging physician population
 - Due to dissatisfaction with changes in medicine (EMR, etc.)

- NCREASE IN USE OF MID-LEVELS
 - Nurse practitioners
 - PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS
 - IN PART DUE TO DUTY-HOUR RESTRICTIONS

TRENDS IN HEALTHCARE - WHAT DOES THIS MEAN TO YOU?

- Few specialties that don't have mid-levels as part of their care team
 - PEDIATRIC ICU
 - RADIOLOGY
 - RADIATION ONCOLOGY

TRENDS IN HEALTHCARE - SEPARATION OF WORKFORCE

- INPATIENT VERSUS OUTPATIENT
 - Most providers that work in a city (>50,000) do one or the other
 - HOSPITALISTS
 - CLINIC PHYSICIANS
 - EXCEPTION: RURAL AREAS

APPROACH TO THE CLINICAL YEARS

- TRY TO DEVELOP AN INTEREST IN ALL AREAS (TRY, I SAY...)
- CATEGORIZE WHAT 'DRAWS YOU TOWARDS' A SPECIALTY VS WHAT 'DRIVES YOU AWAY'
- BE AGGRESSIVE IN SEEKING CLINICAL EXPERIENCE OPPORTUNITIES

MAY START TO 'SPECIALIZE' IN THE AREA THAT MOST INTERESTS YOU

• IN PREPARATION FOR RESIDENCY APPLICATION AND THE MATCH

FOOD FOR THOUGHT...

- WHAT AM | EXCITED ABOUT?
- DO I LIKE STAYING UP ALL NIGHT/PART OF A NIGHT, IF IT MEANS I AM ON A CERTAIN SERVICE (OB, SURGERY)?
- WHEN I AM CALLED EMERGENTLY TO A PARTICULAR SERVICE, AM I THRILLED OR

 DO I CURSE?



• DO I LIKE THE LIFESTYLE THIS SPECIALTY PROVIDES?

NO SPECIALTY CHOSEN AT END OF PILLAR 2?

- DO NOT FRET!
- MORE TIME FOR PERSONAL INSIGHT IN PILLAR 3 (NO HQIP, NO ETHICS, ETC.)
- Take 2-4 week rotations where you can experience the specialty as a Pillar 3 student
 - DO YOU MISS OTHER AREAS OF MEDICINE?
 - CAN YOU ENVISION SPENDING YOUR LIFE IN THIS ONE SPECIALTY?
 - You have time to decide!
 - This is the beauty of a 16-month long pillar 3!

FROM NRMP 2019 RESULTS AND DATA: TABLE #4

- 18,925 US SENIORS IN MATCH (+107 FROM 2018)
- <u>5,080</u> US-Internationals (+5)
- <u>6,001</u> OSTEOPATHIC (+1387)
- <u>6,869</u> Non-US Internationals (-198)
- <u>38,376</u> TOTAL APPLICANTS FOR **35,185** SLOTS
- Positions available per applicant = $0.92 (\uparrow)$

2019 MATCH DATA

OVERALL MATCH RATES

- US Seniors = 93.9% (COUPLES MATCH 95%)
- OSTEOPATHIC = 84.6% (↑)
- US International = 59% (个)
- Non-US International = 58.6% (个)
- Previous Grads US Seniors = 45.4% (\downarrow)

OVERVIEW OF PILLAR 2 – CAREER PLANNING VIEWPOINT

- Individual self-assessments on careers in medicine (may take more than one time)
- Use white space wisely to learn more about various specialties
 - Use student affairs and/or campus dean to make contact with certain specialties
- TALK TO THE CLASS OF 2020
 - FEEDBACK ON WHY THEY CHOSE THE SPECIALTY THEY DID
 - WHAT TURNED THEM OFF ABOUT A PARTICULAR AREA OF MEDICINE
 - WHO MENTORED THEM IN THEIR PARTICULAR SPECIALTY?
 - This is huge!!!

OVERVIEW OF PILLAR 2 – CAREER PLANNING VIEWPOINT

- PARTICIPATE IN INTEREST GROUPS
- QUERY YOUR ATTENDINGS (IF TIME ALLOWS) DURING CALL OR CLINIC
- QUERY YOUR RESIDENTS AS TO THE PERKS OF THE SPECIALTY
- SEEK INSIGHT TO THOSE WHO KNOW YOU WELL
- Individual career advising/planning session nov-January 2020



OVERVIEW OF PILLAR 3 CAREER PLANNING VIEWPOINT

• APRIL — JULY: "DEAN'S LETTER" INTERVIEW (MSPE)

• June – Sept: Register for ERAS

July – Aug: Register for NRMP

• Aug — Sept: Submit Applications

SEPT 14 – BUT MAY EXTEND TO JANUARY

• Oct – Jan: Interviews (most Oct/Nov/Dec)

• Oct 1, 2019: MSPE Release date (NATIONWIDE)

• February: Rank Order Listing due {3RD Week}

MARCH: MATCH WEEK {3RD WEEK}

MOST CREATE OR UPDATE AT THE BEGINNING OF PILLAR 3

- WILL DISCUSS IN-DEPTH IN CAREER PLANNING SESSION #3
 - SAMPLES
 - CAREER ADVISING MICROSITE
 - CAREERS IN MEDICINE SAMPLES

USMLE STEP 2 CK AND CS

- MAY REGISTER FOR CS UP TO 12-MONTHS PRIOR TO TAKING EXAM
 - CHICAGO CAN BE A POPULAR SITE IN THE PAST AND HARD TO SCHEDULE DURING FEB/MARCH
 - QUICK/LESS EXPENSIVE AIRLINE FLIGHT
 - HOUSTON, CHICAGO, ATLANTA, PHILADELPHIA, LA
- MAY REGISTER FOR CK UP TO 6-MONTHS PRIOR TO TAKING EXAM
 - LESS DIFFICULT TO SCHEDULE AS EXAM CAN BE TAKEN IN TOWN
