Curriculum Description – 3 Pillars

<u>Pillar 1</u>: The Basic Biomedical Science curriculum is presented during the first three semesters as Pillar 1.

<u>Pillar 2</u>: The Core Clinical Clerkships along with Clinical Competencies are presented during semesters four and five as Pillar 2. Pillar 2 uses a Longitudinal Integrated Clerkship form of education. The specialties are Family Medicine, General Internal Medicine, General Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine, Psychiatry, and Neurology. Consequently, the student is not "on" a given specialty for a set number of weeks, but is

actually on all seven specialties throughout the entire year and completes curriculum objectives in those clerkships similar to the more traditional "block" structure.

Pillar 3: Clinical specialties along with elective opportunities are presented during the final three semesters as Pillar 3.

Students are based at one of the three clinical campuses (Rapid City, Sioux Falls or Yankton) for Pillar 2 and Pillar 3, with several students applying for a position at one of the six Frontier and Rural Medicine (FARM) sites for most of their Pillar 2 training.


